Registration for this event is Free to Sutlers and Re-enactors. This event benefits Conococheague Institute and Fort Loudoun Historical Society and vendor donations are welcome.

Site Rules:

- Camping and vehicle parking in designated areas only
- Colonial appearing tents to be used by re-enactors
- A fire pit may be dug but no more than 24" in diameter
- Care must be taken to disturb the terrain and vegetation as little as possible
- No latrines allowed
- No dogs allowed
- Campsites must be cleaned and tidy before leaving. All trash is to be removed.
- All items offered for sale or trade must be appropriate to pre-1790s time period. Ft. Loudoun and Conococheague Institute reserve the right to reject inappropriate items from a re-enactor or Sutler not deemed suitable for this type of event.
- A sutler is any person(s) that sets up a trade shelter or lodge, or sets out a trade blanket or hide with goods offered for sale, trade or barter.
- All trade goods (original, handcrafted and authentic reproductions) shall conform to all federal, state, county and township rules and regulations. For specific information contact the proper authorities in the event area. This is your responsibility.
- Positively NO alcoholic beverages. This will be strictly enforced!
- Animal parts or protected species that do not conform with the laws of the state of Pennsylvania and the Federal Government, shall not be sold, displayed or possessed at this event.
- Cassettes, CD's and Video Tapes are to be displayed in a period container or are to be covered at all times. A period sign may be displayed offering the items for sale.
- Books, patterns, painting, etc. pertaining to the period may be sold, but must be displayed in a period manner.
- Taxes are the responsibility of the Sutler.
- Parking permits will be issued to Sutlers and re-enactors after receipt of your registration.

Safety Rules:

Any person carrying black powder and black powder weapons must belong to a unit invited to participate and be covered by the units liability insurance. No projectiles, bullets or musket balls are to be carried. Only Colonial period weapons will be allowed.

Rules of Behavior:

- ☺ Behavior shall be conducive to helping all re-enactors and the public to have an enjoyable and educational experience.
- ☺ Respect nighttime quiet with no loud music, radios or loud talking.
- ☺ Positively NO alcoholic beverages will be allowed on the site. This will be strictly enforced.
- ☺ Be courteous and respectful of the privacy of others on the site.
- ☺ Enjoy your visit and help others to have a good experience!

Directions to Fort Loudoun site:

From Interstate 81: Exit 10 at Chambersburg, take Route 30 west 13 miles

From Pa Turnpike: Willow Hill Exit, south on Route 75, then Route 30 East approximately 3 miles.

The Fort site is on North Brooklyn Road just off Route 30. A sign is at the end of the road.
